## About the Poem: William Wordsworth

I Wandered Lonely as a Cloud was written in 1807 by the poet William Wordsworth about a large belt of daffodils that he and his sister encountered on the shores of a lake in England. They were both incredibly taken by the view of thousands upon thousands of these beautiful flowers dancing in the wind coming off the lake. A profound sense of majesty and tranquility came across them, which Wordsworth tries to express in his poem.



This poem was introduced to me by my own sister, Brooke, who put Wordsworth's poem in the foreword of her doctorate thesis on coastal seagrass. The plains of underwater grasses blowing in the ebbs and flows ocean currents brought a similar sense of wonder and serenity to her. I'm so very proud of my brilliant sister and her research helping a little known, but extremely important ocean ecosystem.

## About the Composer: Mitchell Fund

I've been a music teacher, composer, and performer in the Puget Sound region of the Pacific Northwest for over 18 years. In 2021 I decided to follow my Walden dreams and built a small, off grid cabin in the foothills of the Cascade mountains. I spend my days amongst nature composing, reading, writing, and teaching remote music lessons.
